Bishop Otter Campus was founded in 1839 in memory of William Otter, Bishop of Chichester. The campus occupies a splendid 38 acre site and is situated within easy walking distance of the city centre which is renowned both historically and culturally. Many of the original buildings remain and blend in with the more modern architecture including a chapel, dining hall, main hall and residential hostels.

Accommodation

Accommodation consists of single rooms with their own hand basin, with a choice of en-suite or shared facilities.

Each hostel has its own fitted kitchen with tea and coffee making facilities available.

Travel

By road, the A3(M) and A29 via Dorking provide direct routes to and from London. There are also regular coach and bus services throughout the area.

By rail, frequent trains from London to Chichester run from Victoria Station (direct route) and from Waterloo (change at Havant). The journey time is approximately one hour and 45 minutes.

With many domestic and international flights, Gatwick and Southampton airports are both approximately one hour away by road or rail. Cross Channel ferries also operate from Portsmouth, Newhaven and Southampton.
