Method of Assessment / Mark Scheme

For each Module, the examination is divided into sections, which are separately marked, i.e.:

- Demonstration
- Theory
- Timing (in solo demonstration to music)
- Rhythm (Module 1 only)

In order to award each module, the candidate must attain more than or equal to 65 marks in each section, and be successful in the 'Timing in solo demonstration to music' section.

Candidates are unsuccessful in the examination if they achieve less than or equal to 64 marks in any one section.

All 4 modules need to be passed before the full qualification is gained, which will be indicated with a final transcript of all Modules achieved and a certificate. The final mark will be calculated on the average of the Demonstration sections, the average of all the Theory sections across all modules, including the mark for Rhythm,.
